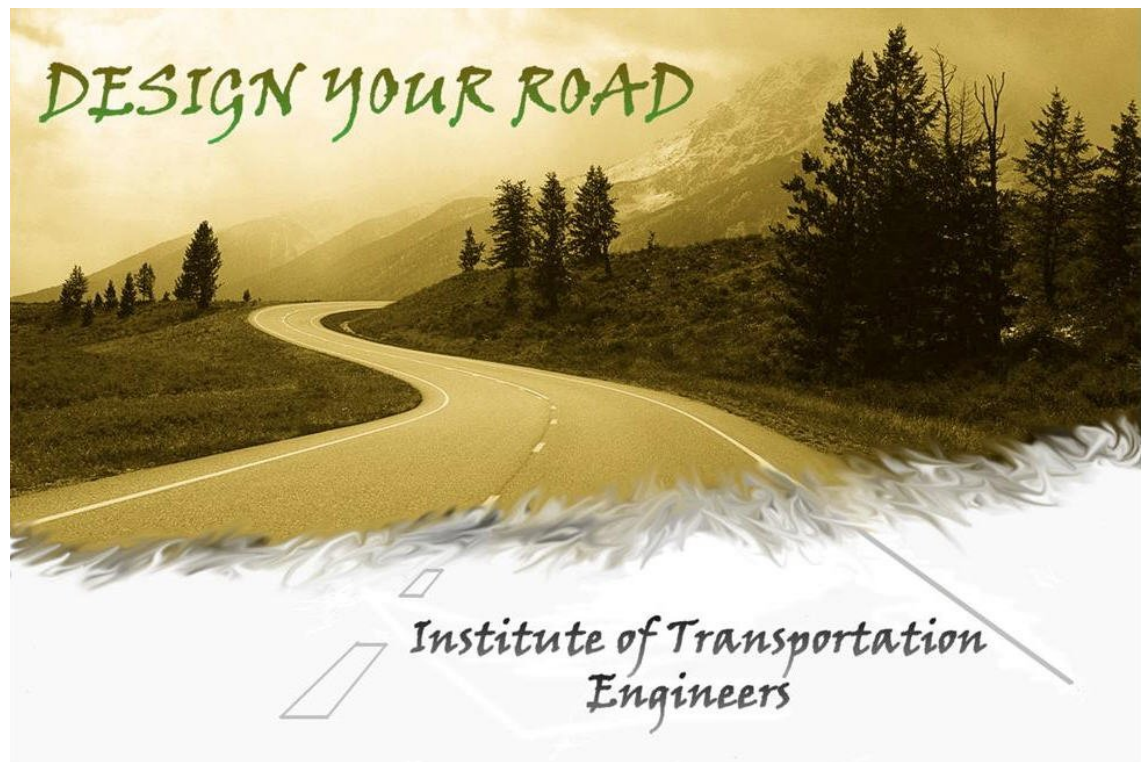
“Design Your Road”: New Slogan Unveiled
